Learning Experiences


Our **Big Question** for this term is: **Are we all the Same?**




Owl Babies by Martin Waddell


Harvest Around the World: Faith, Food & Gratitude

Whole School Learning Objectives:


- Understand the concept of harvest and gratitude across cultures.

Maths

We will be working hard on our reasoning and problem-solving skills, alongside pupils having opportunities to practise their fluency.

Home Learning

Bags

- ❖ Practise your child's spelling words with them in a variety of ways such as playing pairs, spotting them in books, writing a list, writing them in a silly sentence.
